Seyed Javad Miri, Ph.D.

"Critical Social Theory in a Critical Global Context"

Seyed Javad Miri is a Swedish-Iranian Sociologist and Professor at the Institute for Humanities and Cultural Studies in Tehran, Iran. He is a specialist in Islamic social theory, inter-civilizational discourse, and contemporary Islamic thought. He has published numerous books and articles, including, *Revisiting the Critical Legacy of Shah Ismail* (Brill, 2025), *Towards Emancipation: Decolonality and the Critical Social Theory in the Primordial School of Thought* (Ekpyrosis Press, 2025), and co-edited *Ali Shariati: Critical Social Theory and the Struggle for Decolonization* (Ekpyrosis Press, 2025). He is the Founder of the journal *Islamic Perspective* (now *Critical* Perspectives) and also serves as the Co-Director of the Institute for Critical Social Theory.

Dustin J. Byrd is a Professor of Philosophy and Religious Studies at The University of Olivet in Michigan, USA. He specializes in Social and Political Philosophy, with an expertise in the Frankfurt School, the Critical Theory of Religion, and Psychoanalytical Political Theory. He has edited/co-edited numerous books, including Ali Shariati: Critical Social Theory and the Struggle for Decolonization (Ekpyrosis Press, 2025); The Many Faces of Populism: Perspectives from Critical Theory and Beyond (Brill, 2024); Sigmund Freud as a Critical Social Theorist: Psychoanalysis and the Neurotic in Contemporary Society (Brill, 2024), and Syed Hussein Alatas and Critical Social Theory: Decolonizing the Captive Mind (Brill, 2024), and has authored many more, including, The Dark Charisma of Donald Trump: Political Psychology and the MAGA Movement (Ekpyrosis Press, 2023), and The Frankfurt School and the Dialectics of Religion: Translating Critical Faith into Critical Theory (Ekpyrosis Press, 2020).
